

Wolfe REDO/RETEST PROCEDURES

Students who do not demonstrate mastery of an objective that has been taught will receive re-teaching to help them gain a better understanding of the topic.

- While all teachers are expected to re-teach for mastery of TEKS, grade 1-5 teachers in numerically graded courses, will also provide reasonable opportunity to reassess mastery of TEKS when a student fails to master content and receives a failing grade (below 70%) on major tests.
- A student who receives a grade below 70% on a major assignment in a course (2x multiplier in grades 1-4, major grade category in grade 5) will automatically participate in re-teaching and will be retested. This one retest/redo opportunity applies only to subjects that yield a numerical average on the report card. The retest will assess the same content but may have different questions and format.
- Routine assessments, such as: EDL/Fountas & Pinnell reading inventories and math fact quizzes do not apply to this protocol.
- The teacher will schedule the re-teaching during small group instruction. Students will be notified in advance of the date for the reassessment. Retesting will occur during class time.
- The student's grade for the test will be determined by averaging the original and retest grade, and limiting the highest passing grade entered in the grade book to a 70%. Due to instructional pacing parameters, students will only be given one opportunity to retest. Below you will find examples of how grades will be averaged and entered in the grade book.

Original Test Grade	Retest Grade	Average Test Grade	Submitted to Grade Book
